Laura visited all the junior English classes to talk about what she does and how she can help students with parttime jobs and career exploration. She also held one-on-one meetings with about 20 different students, some of them multiple times. Seven of the students were recommended by the Guidance Dept for extra help and support. Laura set up a table at lunches one day with information on job opportunities. She met with the owner of Taylor Box, a manufacturer in Warren, RI about working with them in various ways including arranging a company tour for students. Laura is also working on scheduling 2 or 3 additional career spotlights for next month.
