Looking ahead to the Summer of Work and Learning

As the academic year comes to a close, the School-to-Career Partnership is ramping up for their Summer of Work and Learning! This six-week program provides paid work experience for underserved youth from all four of our partner high schools. This is possible thanks to our partners and donors including MassHire Bristol Career Center, Bristol County Savings Bank, HarborOne Bank, and the United Way of Greater Attleboro/Taunton.

Last summer the SCP was able to place 27 students at various work sites in the community, including Sturdy Memorial Hospital, Attleboro Arts Museum, Attleboro Parks and Forestry, and the Hockomock YMCA. There were also a number of students placed at Attleboro High School in the Culinary Program, the Farm 2 Table Initiative, and working on summer maintenance projects.
